What are Waivers?

Medicaid Waivers can provide access to the above community based services and supports.

Did You Know?

- Waiver eligibility for children does **NOT** depend on the parent's income
- There are different types of waivers and each waiver provides a different set of services
- Different waivers have different standards that have to be met to receive services
- An individual must be screened to decide if they can receive waiver services
- Some waivers have waiting lists
- If an individual has a waiver, they have Medicaid insurance
- Children (21 and under) who have Medicaid, have additional coverage that will pay for immunizations, check-ups, labs, eye exams and glasses, hearing aids, nursing services and more (EPSDT)
- Individuals with Medicaid and private health insurance may be eligible for HIPP or HIPP for Kids where Medicaid may reimburse the individual for all or a portion of their private insurance cost (1-800-432-5924)

Getting Started

Elderly or Disabled with Consumer Direction (EDCD) — Individuals must have a medical need and need assistance with activities of daily living — no age requirements if you have a disability — occupational, physical and speech therapy are considered medical services. **Contact your local Department of Health for a screening.**

Intellectual Disability Waiver (ID) — For individuals with an intellectual disability or individuals under age six that are at developmental risk of having an intellectual disability. **Contact your local Community Services Board for a screening.**

Individual and Family Developmental Disabilities Supports Waiver (DD) — For Individuals age six or older with a developmental disability — may not have an intellectual disability. (Autism, Spina Bifida) **Must be screened at your local Child Development Clinic.**
